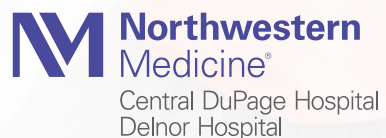

More than 150 board-certified pediatric specialists on the Lurie Children’s medical staff are on the medical staffs at Central DuPage Hospital and/or Delnor Hospital. These pediatric specialists work with experienced pediatric nurses and other compassionate caregivers to treat thousands of infants, children and teens each year.

Referring physicians and their patients benefit from fully coordinated and comprehensive care close to home.

24-hour on-site inpatient pediatric expertise

Neonatologists, intensivists and hospitalists provide around-the-clock on-site services in the Central DuPage Hospital Level III Neonatal ICU, Pediatric ICU and general pediatric inpatient units. Private rooms, playrooms and procedure suites give families a child-friendly, child-focused place to heal.

For infants with low birth weight, premature infants and infants needing special or intensive care, the state-of-the-art Level II-E Special Care Nursery at Delnor Hospital has seven beds with Lurie Children’s neonatologists and/or neonatal nurse practitioners providing 24-hour on-site care.

Central DuPage Hospital Pediatric Emergency Department

Board-certified pediatric emergency medicine specialists and compassionate, experienced nurses provide care in a child-focused environment. These experts have access to state-of-the-art technology, equipment specifically designed for children, and other pediatric services such as Lurie Children’s medical imaging.

Pediatric Emergency Department hours

Seven days a week: 9 am–1 am

Last pediatric patient registration in the Pediatric Emergency Department at Central DuPage Hospital is before 12 midnight.

If a child needs emergency medical attention outside of Pediatric Emergency Department hours, families can expect dedicated care in the general Central DuPage Hospital Emergency or Delnor Hospital Emergency Department.

Pediatric Outpatient Centers

The Pediatric Outpatient Center at Central DuPage Hospital offers convenient access to a comprehensive array of more than 25 pediatric specialties staffed by faculty of Lurie Children's. The Pediatric Outpatient Center at Delnor Hospital provides five pediatric specialties through Lurie Children's physicians.

Central DuPage Hospital Pediatric Infusion Center

Specially trained and certified pediatric nurses administer intravenous infusions and chemotherapy to pediatric patients. Child Life Services provides toys, activities and distractions to help make the experience as stress-free as possible.

Pediatric inpatient and outpatient surgery

Pediatric specialists perform surgeries for conditions related to acquired diseases, congenital and acquired malformations, and tumors. These surgical programs include the Lurie Children's at Central DuPage Hospital Adolescent Bariatric Surgery program. Many procedures are completed through minimally invasive techniques that can shorten hospital stays and speed recovery.

Same-day surgery

Some minor surgeries may be performed as part of the Same-Day Surgery Program at Central DuPage Hospital. This option is offered to patients who meet specific surgical requirements. It includes an appointment in the morning to confirm that the patient is eligible for this surgical procedure. If so, the surgery is scheduled for the same day. The Same-Day Surgery Program is offered every Friday at Central DuPage Hospital with additional availability as needed.

Ronald McDonald House® near Central DuPage Hospital

Northwestern Medicine is committed to providing nationally recognized health care to the communities we serve. In keeping with this mission, Central DuPage Hospital and Ronald McDonald House Charities® of Chicagoland and Northwest

Indiana have built the first Ronald McDonald House in Chicago's western suburbs. The Ronald McDonald House near Central DuPage Hospital is across the street from the hospital in Winfield, Illinois. The facility is one of only five in the Chicagoland area.

Advanced care for pediatric brain tumors

Lurie Children's and Northwestern Medicine Proton Center collaborate to offer patients with pediatric brain, head, neck or spine tumors access to proton therapy, an advanced form of cancer therapy that precisely targets radiation to tumors. In addition, Lurie Children's multidisciplinary Brain Tumor Board plays an integral role in the clinical review of all patients who are undergoing treatment at the center for brain and central nervous system tumors. Lurie Children's pediatric anesthesiologists provide services for children who need to be sedated for proton beam procedures. For more information, call 312.227.4847.

Pediatric medical imaging

All pediatric imaging at Central DuPage Hospital and Delnor Hospital is directed and interpreted by pediatric radiologists from Lurie Children's. To review images and conduct studies requiring the services of a radiologist, a Lurie Children's radiologist is on-site at Central DuPage Hospital from 8 am to 4 pm Monday through Friday.

Pediatric telehealth

Telehealth technology is used for real-time echocardiograms for patients at Central DuPage Hospital. The telemedicine team assists on-site pediatricians and intensivists in the identification and treatment of infants who have possible congenital heart disorders.

Child Life Services

The child life specialists at Central DuPage Hospital, Delnor Hospital and Northwestern Medicine Proton Center are an integral part of the healthcare team and are trained to support the psychosocial needs of children and their families through play, guidance, education and self-expressive activities. They are committed to the practice of family-centered care to relieve a child's fear and anxiety through therapeutic play and distraction techniques as well as to address the needs of siblings affected by a child's illness/hospitalization. Each child life specialist has a bachelor's or master's degree with an emphasis on human growth and development, education, psychology or a related field.

Experienced medical teams, 24/7

Lurie Children's at Central DuPage Hospital and Delnor Hospital medical professionals are committed to providing compassionate, skilled care focused on your patient's wellness. For the most critical inpatient needs, Lurie Children's neonatologists staff the Central DuPage Hospital Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) and the Special Care Nursery at Delnor Hospital; pediatric intensivists and hospitalists staff the Central DuPage Hospital Pediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU). These specialists are available for consultation in the general Central DuPage Hospital Pediatric Inpatient Unit as well.

- The Central DuPage Hospital Pediatric Emergency Department includes board-certified pediatric emergency medicine specialists to care for infants, children and adolescents experiencing a medical or behavioral health emergency.
 - Open 9am-1 am, 7 days a week

- Pediatric radiologists are available on-site at Central DuPage Hospital and remotely to direct and interpret medical images and scans.

The General Surgery Department provides general surgery for problems related to the head, neck, chest, abdomen and extremities, congenital malformations and solid tumors. Surgeons can use minimally invasive techniques for many abdominal and thoracic procedures, including single-incision laparoscopic techniques. Special interests include treatment of chest wall deformities such as pectus excavatum (“sunken chest”) and pectus carinatum (“pigeon chest”) using a minimally invasive technique.

Some minor surgeries can also be performed as part of the Same-Day Surgery Program at Central DuPage Hospital. This option is offered to patients who meet specific surgical requirements.
